Grievous of Rheumatism being sick & weak but of sound
mind and memory think to be thoroughly for the same
and because the uncertainty of this mortal life and
that it is appointed for all men once to die I come to
Judgement And as to the temporal estate which at hath
been pleased God to bestow upon me I give bequeath &
dispose of in the following manner Infirmities I
last unto my beloved wife Catherine Green the use of
my plantation whereon I now live during her
natural life together with all my stock of every
kind and household furniture and after her decease
to be sold except the land at the discretion of my
executors hereafter named and the money thereof
money to be equally divided amongst all my surviving
Children or if any should decease before that period
then there have to possess the same there as if they
were living I Give and bequeath to my son
Thomas Green the one half of my lands the
purpose remaining a straight way from east to West
to include one hundred and fifty acres to him the
one Thomas Green his heirs and assigns forever

to include one hundred and fifty acres to him the
said Thomas Green his heirs and assigns for ever
provided the said Thomas Green when he comes of
age and paper the said land pays to his sister to
wit. Elizabeth Sarah Martha, Mary Catharine &
Peggy Green fifteen pounds a piece as money paper
and exchanged in the year one thousand seven
hundred and seventy four And if the said Thomas
should ~~decease~~ before he comes of age or marries to
have an heir then the said land to be sold & the
money arising to be equally divided amongst all
my children as then living except Bartlett Green my
eldest son who has had part herebefore. I do give
and assign all to my son Joseph Green the remainder
of my land including my plantation which is one
hundred and fifty acres to him the said Joseph Green
his heirs and assigns for ever provided the said
Joseph pays unto his sister as the said Thomas
was as above mentioned And if he should ~~decease~~
before he comes of age or has a lawful heir then
the said land to be sold and the money thence

being to be equally divided as mentioned above. Last
