 as the stock of horses, cattle, sheep and hogs, also all the household and
 kitchen furniture, and plantation utensils, wherein I now live also all
 the land except on with improved furniture which said said I
 have in N. D. Douth to her and her heirs forever with one riding
 chair and harness to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and
 bequeath to my son Arch Douth the following Slave to wit Jack N.
 Long, Maria, Sam. Ring, Wynt, Liza, Little Mary, also all the
 goods to me by my Father David Douth by Deed of Gift in both
 sides of Leesburg's Creek, and all the stock of horses, cattle, sheep
 and hogs, and all the household and kitchen furniture, together to
 be the same of what hand or estate whatsoever, excepting the
 marriage with my wife and in case my son Arch Douth, die
 before he comes to the age of Eighteen years or thereabouts he shall
 receive Jack, Ned, Sam, Maria, Sam, Dick, Liza, Little Mary, and
 my kitchen wife her and her heirs for ever and that my son
 Arch should have all his Estate both real and personal in
 his possession at the age of Eighteen years. Should he die before
 he comes to that age then the said lands, stock, and
 furniture should be divided among his children.
