gives it and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian
like manner at the direction of my executors And as for
what would be able to it hath pleased God to bless me with
to give in manner as follows, to wit, I give & bequeath
my beloved Sisters Mary Anne Rainey, Sally Morgan, Paul
Morgan, Nancy Morgan & Betsey Morgan after my death
are paid them equal proportion of one hundred & forty pounds
when they come of age or marry if the cash is collected
that I have I give and bequeath to my Aunt Elizabeth
Morgan one hundred & forty pounds. I do appoint my father Reuben
Morgan & Philip Morgan Executors of this my last will
& Testament to which whereof I have heretofore set my hand
