 her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my dear Wife
 Wife Anna the use of my Richland plantation and one third
 part of the profits of my estate during her natural life. Likewise
 all my household servants and their increase also my Chariot
 and Horses my plate and other household furniture to do as
 she thinks proper with provided she gives them among my
 children. All the rest of my estate I give and bequeath
 and the remainder thereof to my Will.
