County being weak in body but in sound and perfect memory thanks
to Almighty god and calling to remembrance the frailty and Uncertainty
of human life have made this my last will and Testament in
manner following I give commit my soul into the hands of my
merciful creator hoping for remission of my sins through the
merits of my blessed redeemer Jesus Christ my body I leave to be
buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
after my Just debts are honestly paid I lend to my dear and loving
wife Susannah Walker my whole Estate as it stands real and
personal during her widowhood or life only Except my Negro
boy Abram. Item I give to my son George Hightower Walker
after my wife Susanna Walkers marriage or decease the land I
now live on with all my stock of all kinds with all my Household
and Kitchen Furniture with four Negroes namely, Bob, Dick, and
young Hannah, & Lucy, with all the rising Profits of the Estate

Except the negroes as I shall hereafter mention to him and his heirs
forever. But in case my son George should die without Issue
of his body, then it's my desire that they should be
divided Amongst my three sons Namely W^m Walker, Tandy Walker
Analous Walker to them and their heirs forever. - Then I give
to my son Benjamin Walker five shillings sterling to him
and his heirs forever. - Then I give to my daughter Ann Smith
five shillings sterling to her and her heirs forever. - Then
I give to my daughter Elizabeth Reed five shillings sterling
to her and her heirs forever. - Then I give to my daughter
Pamphila Smith five shillings sterling to her and her
heirs forever. - Then I give to my Daughter Molly Andrews
five shillings sterling to her and her heirs forever. - Then
I give to my three sons after my wife's and my death
or marriage again namely William Walker, Tandy Walker,
Analous Walker to them and their heirs forever.

Went to my son Sandy Walker after my decease one Negroe
boy Abram during his life and then after his decease I give
to my his son Robert Walker the said Abram to him and
his heirs forever lastly I nominate and Appoint my dear and
loving wife Susanna Walker with Elisha Arnold and Samuel
Marshall Executors of this my last will and testament and
as trustees to see this will Executed hereby revoking and disannulling
all former wills by me made and declaring this only to be my
last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this thirty first day of December One
Thousand seven hundred and Eighty five
