

I Beate Annunt of the County of Mecklenburg do make
and declare this my last Will Testament in presence of
four following my

Witness on the first place that all my debts be just
paid and that remainder of my estate be disposed of as
follows. I give my wife Mary Beunwell the use of all
my estate during her widowhood and in her case
I should marry then I desire that she may be allowed
the same as if I had died intestate.

I give my daughter Elizabeth Beunwell one eighth
part of my negroes at the time she shall come of
age or marry. I also give my daughter Elizabeth one
seventh part of my money and stocks to be settled as
she shall come of age or marry including what may
be raised out of the estate. I give unto my son William
Beunwell one fourth part of all my estate both real &
personal to him and his heirs for ever. I give to my
son Charles Beunwell the rest of my estate not
already disposed of. My desire is that if either of my
children should die before they are of age or marry their
share be equally divided between the surviving
ones and should they all die

any part to be sold by ~~deeds~~ between the surviving
ones and should they all die before they come of age
or marry then I give my estate to be equally divided
between my two brothers Lewis & Nathaniel & my
sister John Case to them and their heirs for ever
I desire my estate may not be appraised and that my
wife may have the use of my Chariot & Horses & all my
household furniture during her life. I desire that my
debts may be manifested out of my estate & the residue
of the profits to be laid out in ~~debts~~ or interest or
mortgage. I desire my sons may have the best
education that can be given them. I desire my estate
may not be divided before my daughter comes of age
or marry and that my wife may live in a decent
manner and if any money should be left that then my
executors do with it as before directed for the benefit of
my children. I appoint ^{my wife} my father, my worthy friends
and business of ~~trustees~~ my executors of this my
last will and testament & I bequeath to my children
