my body I want to be buried at the discretion
of my executors hereinafter named.

Then I do make my daughter law Sarah Eastland
the said daughter my sole and lawful executrix
beginning at the upper end of the said tract
thence running down each of the old lines unequal
distance as far as will contain four hundred acres
thence my life for one year and then to be divided among
my children

intention my will and devise is that my Grandson John
Cauldwell should have professional the age of twenty one years
of the said land to him and his heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath to my sons Thomas and William
Cauldwell all the rest of the Land I now possess to be equally
inherited between them to them and their heirs forever.

My will and devise is that all my moveable estate to wit
and to be equally divided between all my Children that are
living at my decease.

Lastly I do appoint my friend James Anderson and my
son William Cauldwell executors of this my last will and
testament I do hereby revoke all other wills by me formerly
made declaring this to be my last will and testament.

the name of Thomas Eastland to the said will subscribed
to be the proper hand writing of the said testator he being
sworn therewith and therefore the said will is
ordered to be recorded and on the motion of William East-
land of the co. called thereon named who made oath thereto
together with Edward Lewis & John Hubbard his counsel
entered into and acknowledged their bond in the sum of
one thousand pounds conditioned as the said order directs
And leave was granted him for obtaining a probat of the
said will and for and liberty being returned for the same in ecclesi-
astical records to join the probat when he shall think fit
