excepted. I give to my son Thomas Evans the gun also to my Grand
son Evans Evans son of James Evans and Jane his wife. —
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Evans one
feather bed and furniture. — Now it is my further will and I do,
Order, that after the decease of my wife that all the remaining
part of my estate besides what I have above given to be divided
equally between my son Thomas Evans and my daughter Mary
Evans and my Grand children viz John Evans Evans Evans
and

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and Nancy Brannon. Now it is my further will and I do order
that this my last will and Testament shall be carried after the
desire of my wife to James Anderson of North Carolina for
him to make right to the things to whom I have chosen to have
them. Revoking all other will made heretofore given under my
hand and seal this twenty sixth day of May 1787
