to Almighty God and bidding to Remembrance the Truly
Virtuous life of my dear husband my late wife
in the manner following I have bound it

Attest to the hands of my Murtherer hoping for Amputation
of my arms through the hands of my Physic Physicians I am leaving
My Body to be Buried at the Discretion of my Executors
Hereafter Named I am leaving Just Debt as formerly paid
I leave unto my Dear and Loving wife Mary Thompson the use
of my whole and sole Estate During her life or widowhood -
only and after her marriage again there to be Raised out of my
Estate My friends only to her and her heirs forever -
I have here bequeathed of my Negroes and other Estate I have to be
divided in 10 parts and Equally Divided amongst all my surviving
Children to them and their heirs forever also my land to be set up
and sold by my Executor within 6 months thereafter it is my will
and Desire that the money shall be Deemed with my other
Estate and Divided as the Rest of my other Estate Equally
amongst all my surviving Children

...all my surviving children as above to them
and their heirs forever I implore it is my will and desire that the
best should appear three such men as they shall think
proper to lay of my Negroes and other Estate in full paying
surviving children lastly I nominate and appoint my
Dear and loving wife Lem of Thompson Henry Delony
George Bucknole Executors of this my last will and Testament
and as Executor under this will executed Henry Bucknole and
Deputy at James Will by one man was Declaring
the only to Henry last Will and Testament In the presence of
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty third day
of January 1782

At a Court held for Mecklenburg County the 13th March 1768
This last Will and Testament of Wille Thompson was proved

William Shelton being very sick and weak I make and
Witness his last Will and Testament I bequeath and Request
to my wife Mary Shelton my land and Stock of horse Cattle
and household for her life and after her Decease to my Brother
John Shelton after paying all my Debts Except my
Gravestone Great coat and one side of leather which I be-
queath to my brother John Shelton this the 25th
