In the name of God Amen I Thomas Endicott of Mecklenburg County
planter but poor in wealth but in perfect mind and memory thanks be given
unto God for the same. Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and
knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die do make and Ordain
this my last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I
Recommend my soul into the hands of the Almighty God that gave it me
and my body I Command to the earth to be buried in decent Christian's burial at the
discretion of my executors Nothing wanting but at the General resurrection I shall
arise the same again by the Almighty power of God and as touching such worldly estates
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life with John Gilmour and

dispose of the same in the following manner and form - I now give and bequeath
to my son Thomas Bulbreath tract of my land that I now live on containing
203 acres after the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever - I now give to my
loving wife Margaret Bulbreath the land I now live on and five Negroes by names
Charles, Dick, Fice, Wm. Hannah during her natural life. - I now give to my
Grand son John Bulbreath son of my son John Bulbreath one negro man named
