and chattels as it hath pleased God for above my deserts to bestow
upon me I do Order give and dispose the same in the following

those debts and dues that I owe in right or conscience to any
manner of person or persons whatsoever shall well and truly be paid to

wife Ann Gregory my land and personal estate during her
widowhood and after that my land to be sold and equally
divided among my four children Ann Gregory Elizabeth Gregory
Mary Gregory and Susanna Gregory I leave my personal estate after
my wifes death to be equally divided among my four children
above mentioned a last of all I do appoint my loving wife Ann
Gregory and her father William Nash my executors
