Brother James Hill also I leave the plantation where I now
live to my wife Elizabeth Hill as long as she lives and after her
decease I give it to my son Eliza Hill also I give to my wife
Elizabeth Hill all my stock of all kinds and house hold furniture
During her life and after her death then to be equally divided
between my four sons and one Daughter I leave to all also it

During her life and after her death then to be equally divided
between my faw. sons and my Daughter Francis Hill also it
is my desire for William Hendrick to run the dividing line between
himself and William Hill by the County Surveyor also it is my
desire that Peter Crafford shall pay six pounds sixteen shillings
which the Balance he owes for the land he bought of me also
I leave William Hendrick and my wife Elizabeth Hill ex-
-ecutors of my estate Given under my hand & Seal
