My Will is that my Executors Rent a piece of Land on such terms as they shall think proper to work part of my Negroes on, and that the Ballance of the Money arising from the sale of my Land if any such, be applied towards building Houses for my family on such land as they shall rent or on the Land that I have rented of Col<sup>r</sup> Beverley in Caroline County as they shall think proper, and if that money will not hold out than upon the profits of my Estate before any Division of my Estate be made. 8<sup>th</sup>. My Will & desire is that if any of my Children should die before they have a Right to a dividend, that the part of such Child or Children be equally divided between my Wife and the surviving Children. 9<sup>th</sup>. My Will is that what ever part of my Estate shall belong to my Wife by this my Will shall at her Death be divided between all my Children. 10<sup>th</sup>. My Will is that Betty a Mulattoe Woman be in my Wifes part of the Negroes, and after my Wifes death, the said Betty shall belong to such one of my Children as she shall think proper to make choice of. 11<sup>th</sup>.
