Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Anne Murray a Negro Girl named Guil Beck, to her and her Heirs forever, provided nevertheless, that should the said Negro Girl Beck, die, before my said Daughter Mary Anne, comes of age, my Will is that my said Daughter Mary Anne, be intitled to and receive, another Negro Girl out of my Estate of equal value, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Harriett Murray a Negro Girl named Margery to her and her Heirs forever, provided nevertheless, that should the said Negro Girl Margery die, before my said Daughter Harriett comes of age, my Will is that my said Daughter Harriett, be intitled to, and receive, another Negro Girl out of my Estate of equal value, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Fanny Murray, a Negro Girl named Christian to her and her Heirs forever, provided nevertheless, that should the said Negro Girl Christian die, before my said Daughter Fanny comes of age, my Will is that my said Daughter Fanny be intitled to, and receive, another Negro Girl out of my Estate of equal value, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item, I lend unto my loving Wife Anne Murray my whole Estate whithersoever personal during the time of her Widowhood (excepting the Legacies bequeathed as above) but should my said loving wife Anne Murray marry again, in in that Case my Will and Desire is that my Negroes, and all my personal Estate, be equally divided amongst my three Daughters above mentioned, and that they have and enjoy the same to them and their Heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Anne Murray the Land whereon I now live, to her and her Heirs forever after the decease of my loving Wife, on Condition that should the said Mary Anne Murray, then pay to my Daughter Fanny Murray the Sum of Two hundred and fifty Pounds Current Money. - But should my said Daughter Mary Anne die under Age or before Marriage, then in that Case my Will is that the said Land descend to my Daughter Harriett Murray on her paying my Daughter Fanny the Sum of one hundred Pounds Current Money only.
