will and Testament in manner and form following I do recommend my soul
to God that gave it and my body to be buried by my Executors hereafter Naming
them I give and bequeath unto my sister Martha Williamson of Middlesex County
all the Land that was my Mother's before her Marriage I give also
my sister Martha and her heirs and assigns forever and also I give to my
sister Martha Williamson my Negro man named Jemey and the two sons that my
father gave me by his will to her my said sister Martha and her heirs and assigns
for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Robert Williamson son of my brother Robert
Williamson all my other Land that was my Mother's before her Marriage to my fa-
ther I give all that Land to my said son Robert Williamson and his heirs &
assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Martha Williamson my young horse upon
a pillion my son Elizabeth the wife of John Smith my Riding mare and saddle
and Bridle.

Item I give and bequeath all the Remainder of my Estate that was given me by
the last will & Testament of my father I give it all to my sister Francis the
wife of John Aldon and my sister Martha Williamson and my son Robert
Williamson son of my brother Robert Williamson to be Equally divided amongst
them three and to their heirs and assigns for ever and lastly I constitute Or-
dine & appoint my brother John Aldon and my sister Martha Williamson
to be my Executors of this my last will & Testament In Testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 23rd day of April 1726.
