and other lambes which I gave and bequeath unto my loving

Bastley and the fifty weight of Cloves to equally divide
between my dear two Daughters and if any thing more
should happen to come in for me give and bequeath the
same unto my loving Daughter Francis, This my will and
desire that my Robert Dravell have the gardynage of my
Daughter Francis Nash and what of the inheritance
to her to no man in the land by portion of the said
Robert Dravell till my said Dear Daughter shall come
to full age of forty six yere or day of her marriage
then full happen - * - -

the 13 dayes of January this year of our Lord

to witness my last will and testament making full and
the former will and testament by me before made
and witness whereof I have written this day and
and make this 10th day of May one thousand eight
hundred.
