in a Christian like manner according to the direction of my friends
or Overseers and trustees of this my last will and testament
shall seem most fitt and convenient, and as for my worldly
goods, which God by his infinite mercy hath bestowed upon
me, my last debts and funerals Charges being first
satisfied and paid by my Executors Overseers or trustees of this my
will, I give and dispose of the same as followeth

I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Francis Nash my
third part of the Estate my husband Jacob Nash died possessed
of according to appraisment recorded in Middlesex County Court
I give unto my said daughter Francis Nash my two best Gowns
and four petticoats and all the rest of my woollen apparel
and as for my wearing Linnen Cloaths it is my will and desire
that they be equally divided between my two loving daughters
Francis Nash and Hannah Bosley

Now it is my will and desire that the Goods which I expect to come
in out of England for me be disposed of as followeth

in out of England for me be disposed of as followeth being
about four pounds, that is to say one half of Curtains & Valances
our father and I gave and a pair of Blankets one Gold Ring
and silver thimble which I gave and bequeath unto my loving
daughter Frances Nash and the other Ring and silver thimble
I gave and bequeath unto my loving daughter Hannah
Prossley and the fifty weight of Silver be equally divided
between my dear two daughters and if any thing more
should happen to come in for me I give and bequeath the
same unto my loving daughter Frances. It is my will and
order that in Robert Daniell have the Guardianship of my
dear daughter Frances Nash and what of the Estate belongs
Robert Daniell tell my said dear daughter that when
she full age of twenty one years or day of marriage
shall first happen

Now this is my will and order that my friend Mr Robert Daniell
have the Guardianship of my said dear daughter Hannah
Prossley and what part of the Estate belongs to her when
she in the hands and possession of the said Robert Daniell
shall my said dear daughter shall come to full age or
marriage or day of marriage which shall
first happen

It is my will and order that the above be in full of my

which I have in my right hand and which I have
in my left hand and which I have in my right hand
and which I have in my left hand and which I have in my right hand

Lastly I appointed my two loving daughters to be Executors and
my two loving friends to be Overseers and to settle of
this my last will and testament making null and void
all former wills and testaments by me heretofore made
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 10th Day of May One thousand Seven
hundred
