and so declare this present Writing to be my last Will & Testament
I do Give, assign and Commend my Soul into the hands of

Almighty God who gave it me hoping for the redemption of
my soul through the merits of our Saviour Jesus Christ
and my body to be buried in a Decent & Christian manner
by my Executors hereafter mentioned And as for my Worldly
Goods which it hath Pleased Almighty God to bestow on me
I Give and dispose of as followeth Viz. I Give and bequeath
unto my Granddaughter Sarah Baldwin
daughter of William and Sarah Baldwin, one Cow and
Calf to be paid her at the age of Seventeen by my Executors
hereafter mentioned. I Give and bequeath unto my
three Grandsons (to Wit) John Tuggle, Henry Tuggle and
James Tuggle Sons of my son Henry Tuggle deceased to each
one Shilling Sterling and no more I Give & bequeath
unto my Grandson William Mansfield one Shilling Sterling
and no more I Give the Rest and Residue of my Estate all

of Singular Both Real and personal I Give unto my loving
Wife Elizabeth Tuggle during her Natural life or Widowhood
And at her Death or Marriage I give the same as followeth
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Tuggle one
Certain Tract or Parcel of Land whereon he now lives
being the Land which my Father purchased of Richard
Lewis containing by Estimation one hundred Acres be the
same more or less I give the same unto the said Joseph
Tuggle to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give and
bequeath unto my son Thomas Tuggle all the Land and
Plantation whereon I now dwell being granted by Patent
to my Father containing by Estimation one hundred of Ten
Acres be the same more or less I give the same unto the
said Thomas Tuggle to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give

and bequeath unto my son Thomas Tugle my Brandy
still with his cup and Worm Horn I give & bequeath
unto my Daughter Rachel Whom my one Negro Girl
named Jude I give the said Girl and her Increase unto
the said Rachel and her heirs for ever I Give and
bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Tugle one Negro Girl
named Nan I give the said Girl & her Increase to the
Ann Tugle & her heirs for ever. I Give and bequeath
unto my son Benjamin Tugle to him & his heirs for ever
one Negro boy named Jack I Give & Bequeath also
unto my son Benjamin Tugle my Gun I Give &
bequeath unto my son William Tugle one Negro boy named
Peter to him & his heirs for ever I Give and bequeath
also unto my son William Tugle my Pistols & Rods I Give
My Will and desire is that the Rest and Residue of my Estate

not heretofore given be Equally Divided amongst all my
Children that are now alive. Item my Will and devise also
is that the rest of my personal and Movable Estate not
heretofore given be Equally Divided amongst my own
Children James Brown & Elizabeth Wood Children of my
Present Wife by her former husband that is my devise
that the said James Brown and Elizabeth Wood have an
Equal part of my personal and movable Estate with my own
Children. Provided Nevertheless that nothing herein shall
be Construed to bar my Loving Wife from a child's part of all
my Estate both Real and Personal (the particular Legacies
except) after her decease that is my Will and devise is that
in case my Wife Elizabeth Tugler should decease that then

I do have a whole part of of all my Estate both real &
Personal (the aforesaid Legacies Excepted) and moreover
I Item my Will and devise is that my son William Tuggle
be & full age to act for himself at my Death as though
he were twenty one years old. I Item my Will and
devise is that my Estate may not be brought to an

Appraisalment. I Item my Will and devise is of I humbly
beg the favour that my Executors Henry Thacker & Captain
Thomas Price Divide my Estate as it is before directed.

And I do hereby ordain constitute & appoint my loving
Wife Elizabeth Tuggle and my beloved son Thomas
Tuggle Executors of this my last Will and Testament
