Divided between them all.

And I likewise leave Robert George, John and William
Southcoat and Anne Soderwick and my Executors

of November in the year of our Lord God 1744 I have
and leave following.

First my Debts being paid I give to my Loving

Divided between them all.

And I bequeath leave Robert George, John and William
Southworth, John and John George to be my Executors
of this my last Will and Testament Give to my hand this
20th day of Nov 1744.
