 either by word or mouth or writing and this is only to be taken for my last will
 and Testament and none other. I give and bequeath my soul with all ready God my
 favour and Redeemer in whose end by the Merits of Jesus Christ I trust and
 believe assuredly to be saved and to have full Remission and Forgiveness of all my
 finnes past and that my soul with my body at the general Day of Resurrection
 shall rise again with God and through the Merits of Christ shall inherit posses
 sion and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his Elect and Chosen and my
 Body to be buried in such place and Christian manner where it shall please my last
 hereafter to appoint. And now settling of my temporal Estate and such goods
 Chattells and Debts as it hath pleased God far above my Deserts to bestow upon me
 I do now give and Dispose the same in manner and form following: That is to say
 first I will that all those Debts and duties I owe in Right or Satisfaction to any person or per
 sons whatsoever be Contented and paid or cause to be paid within convenient time
 after my decease by my Executor hereafter Named.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Dear and Loving wife Mary Gibbs all my
 Land to her and her heirs for Ever.

Item for all the Rest of my Estate both Regall and personall I lend to my aforesaid
 Loving wife During her Natural life only one peece of Coined silver Cattle to de
 pende to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Roye. And my Desire is that my Estate
 both Regal and Personall before lent to my wife During her Natural life that after
 decease it be equally divided amongst my Children and if my said wife shall think
 fitt in her life time to Dispose of any part of my Estate to any of my Children or
 Child that such Child so advanced in the life of my wife shall have no greater share
 then any of the rest of my Children who shall have their part after her decease.

first of will that all those Debts and duties I owe in Right or Contract to any person or persons whatsoever be Contented and paid or cause to be paid within convenient time after my decease by my Executor hereafter. Named.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Dear and Loving wife, Mary Gibbs all my Land to her and her Heires for ever.

Item for all the Rest of my Estate both Regall and personall I lend to my aforesaid Loving wife during her Natural life only one peece of Coined Silver to the value pence to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Royce. And my Desire is that my Estate both Regal and Personall before lent to my wife during her Natural life that after decease it be equally divided amongst my Children and if my said wife shall think fitt in her life time to Dispose of any part of my Estate to any of my Children or Child that such Child so provided in the life of my wife shall have no greater share then any of the rest of my Children who shall have their part after her decease. my Desire is that my Estate be neither Given away nor Appraised Lastly I do constitute and appoint my Dear and Loving wife my whole and sole Executrix of this my Last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this fourteenth day of June 1726.
