In the name of God amen  
I John Segar of Middlesex County do make this my last Will  
Testament in manner & form following, Viz  
I do give and bequeath unto Jane Segar Nicolas all my  
Estate real and Personal to her and to the Issue of her body  
except such Legacies as is hereafter given  
Item my Will and desire is that if Jane Segar live to enjoy my  
Estate and to have Children to enjoy it after her then my

Desire is, that she or her heirs shall pay unto my two  
brothers Oliver Segar, & William Segar fifty pounds Sterling  
a piece & to the male heirs of there bodies lawfully begotten,  
but if any of them male Heirs should dye then his or their  
part or parts to fall to the next surviving male Heir or  
Heirs belonging to each brother provided my two brothers or  
either of them or any for them do not disturb or Molest with  
any incumbrances & Lawsuits that may be brought in  
against the said Jane Segar concerning the title of my Land  
that then she or they to pay unto them fifty pounds Sterling  
a piece to them or their Heirs

But if in Case Jane Segar should dye without Heir or Heirs of  
her body: then my desire is that Isaac Segar son to Oliver  
Segar may possess all my Land that came to me by my father  
he and the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten: but if he should  
dye without Heir or Heirs of his body lawfully begotten, then  
my desire is that it should go to the next male heir of Oliver,

Divided amongst the male Heirs of William Segar lawfully  
begotten and to their Heirs

Item my Will is that all my Land of my own purchasing  
may go to John Segar son to my brother William Segar  
to him and his Heir or Heirs and if for want of such  
heir or Heirs to the surviving male Heirs of my brother  
Wm Segar

Item my desire is that if Jane Segar should dye without  
Heirs of her body that then my Negroes and Chattles to  
fall to the male heirs of William Segar and Oliver Segar

In conclusion I do make constitute ordain & appoint Jane  
Segar to be Executrix and my two brothers Oliver Segar and  
William Segar to be Executors of this my last Will & Testament  
Signed & sealed in this 13<sup>th</sup> day of October 1729.
