John Smith of the Parish of Christ Church in the County of Middlesex in Virginia being in perfect
memory and remembrance of God (I bless God for it) do make and make this my last will and testament
repealing all other Wills & testaments by me made in what kind soever. First I bequeath my soul
to God hoping to receive pardon for all my sins through the merits of Jesus Christ my redeemer and
for my body to be buried in Christian like manner by my trustees hereafter named
My wife and desire is that all my just debt be first paid. all the rest of my Estate I give & bequeath
I give unto my Brother James Smith my horse named Indian and all my riding apparel
I give unto my nephew John Smith my Negro boy named Robin and my negro woman named
to him & his heirs for ever and further I give unto my said nephew John Smith one bed and furniture
which he himself shall choose one of my best chairs the one half of my pewter one iron pot my
steel one gun at his own choice my blade pistols & holsters my best rapier and his choice of
head of cattle and two of my best hinds
I give and bequeath unto my nephew William Smith all my land and Plantation together
my share of the mill to him and his heirs for ever. and further I give unto my said nephew William
Smith all my silver plate and my branny skin with its appurtenances my chest of drawers & great looking glass
I give and bequeath unto my niece Phoebe Law for the sum of fifteen pounds (current money)
to be paid her when she comes to age or is married in order to buy her a young Negro
I give and bequeath unto my niece Mabel Daniel the sum of fifteen pounds (current money)
to be paid her when she comes to age or is married in order to buy her a young Negro
I give and bequeath unto my Niece Jane Smith the sum of fifteen pounds (current money)
to be paid her when she comes to age or is married in order to buy her a young Negro
I give and bequeath unto my Niece Mary Smith the sum of fifteen pounds (current money)
to be paid her when she comes to age or is married in order to buy her a young Negro

one Negro woman named Sarah Baker and her heirs for her & also bequeath of my furniture
I give and bequeath unto my niece Margaret Smith daughter of my brother James Smith one
negro woman named Mary Baker and her heirs for her & also bequeath of one of my beds & furniture
I give and bequeath unto Mary Freestone daughter of George Freestone and one cow & calf for
be paid her out of my estate when she comes to age or marry.

All the rest and residue of my estate of what kind soever I give and bequeath to be equally divided
between my three nephews Cary Smith William Smith and Donald Smith and my three daughters
they severally come to age or marry.

My will and meaning is that if any of my abovesaid nephews Cary William & Donald & my niece Dine
should die before they come to age or marry that their shares be divided amongst the survivors and it
is further my will that my Negroes not particularly mentioned & given away by name in this my will
be kept to work on my plantation or other rented plantations as my trustees or executors hereafter
named shall see fit and the produce of their labour to be disposed of for the benefit of my abovesaid
nephews Cary William and Donald and my niece Dine.

I do appoint and ordain my three nephews Cary Smith William Smith Donald Smith & my nephew
William Lawton Executors of this my last will and testament. And I do desire my good friend Barth
Gates Esq. to be trustee to advise with my said Executors in the performance of this my will and for that
end and desire that my Executors may not give security for their Executorships unto my estate the appraisers
do witness my hand and seal the day & year first above written.
