and as to what Worldly goods it hath pleased Almighty God to
bestow upon me, I shall Dispose thereof as followeth.

From my Will and Desire is that all my Estate be equally divided
between my Children, to wit, Constant, Harry, Joseph, Mary,
Frances, Betty, and Thomas Seers, and my Granddaughter
Ruth Greenwood, to them and their Heirs given and bequeathed.
Item I lend unto my loving wife Mary Seers, all my Estate during
her widowhood, and in case my said wife should marry Then my
Will is, that my Estate be equally divided as above mentioned among
my said Children, and Grand-Child above mentioned. And I do

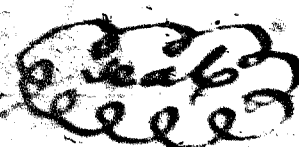
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Item I send unto my loving wife Mary Seers, all my Estate during
