die without issue then my will is that the four Negro men above mentioned And
also the Negro woman And Child be Equally Divided between my two Loving Brethren
Christopher and Charles Curtis

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving Brother Christopher Curtis all my wearing
Clothes and except any Coise five feet and six in length and breadth And
apiece bound but which should have sold by my Executors

Item I give and bequeath all the rest of my Estate to my dear son Christopher Curtis

and as bound but to him found have sold by my Executors

Now I give and sell all the rest of my Estate to my dear son Christopher Curtes to
be managed by my Executors as of for use in the best manner they think
fit for his advantage and my desire that my said son be kept at school by my Exrs
till he shall arrive at the age of twenty years
and lastly I make and create my loving son John Robinson and my good friend
Mr John Smith Junr Exrs of the my last will and Testament hereby making
this writing to be at force and by me made witness my hand and seals this 2 day
