rise and be reunited to my soul together with it inherit everlasting life and
enjoy that place of blessed delight and purity which Almighty God
will prepare for those that love and serve him to whom be ascribed all
praise might Majesty and Dominion now and forever more and my body
I commit to the Earth in full and certain hope of the resurrection as aforesaid
to be decently buried my executor hereafter named
I then it is my will that all my just debts and funeral Charges be paid and
satisfied within convenient time after my decease
I then I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Haskwood all that Tenement
Dividend of Land whereon I now live together with all my land thereunto
appertaining and situate upon up to him my said son Thomas Haskwood and
to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of
such issue as aforesaid then I give and bequeath the said Land to my Grandson
Thomas as Heir and to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever
and for want of such heirs then it is my will and I give and bequeath
the said Land to my Grandson William Cullott and to the heirs of his
body lawfully begotten for ever
I then I give and bequeath unto my said son Thomas Haskwood all my
personal Estate of what Nature or Quality so ever to him and his heirs

the body of this body I do fully begetton for ever. And for want of
John the first of our said John. And bequeath the said land to my Grand
son Thomas Catlett and to the heirs of his body law fully begetton for ever
and for want of such heirs then it is my will and yours and to bequeath
the said land to my Grandson William Catlett and to the heirs of his
body law fully begetton for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my said son Thomas Huslow and all my
heirs for ever of what nature or quality so ever to him and his heirs
in fee simple for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my said son Thomas Huslow and all my
heirs for ever the man named Matt taking and his assigns for ever
the sum of twenty shillings to buy her a mourning
ring of gold.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Humphrey Jones the son of my
daughter Jane Jones twenty shillings to buy him a ring of gold.

And I do hereby make and constitute and appoint my dear and well
beloved son Thomas Huslow and his executors of this my last will and
testament by his special power of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal the 18th day of November 1770.
