I Thomas Fausser being of sound and perfect
mind and memory thank be given unto God therefore do make and ordain this my last Will
& Testament in and to the effect following. That is to say
principally and first of all I commend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it hoping
that Christ's merits & redemption of all my sins and my Body to be buried in a decent manner
at the charge of my Executors hereafter named and as to that Worldly goods with which it hath
pleased God to bless me I give and bequeath the same as followeth
I give that all my Debt and several charges be paid out of my Estate
I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Alice Fausser (whom also I constitute my next of kin
and sole executrix in and to this my last Will and Testament) all my whole Estate and
Chattels both real and personal with all and singular them of me due to be paid to her
or her Assignes during the term of her natural life and after her decease the said Estate to be
divided and equally divided into two parts one namely one half of the said Estate to be bestowed as my
Wife shall think fit to be done by will and the other half to be bestowed to England and equally
divided between my son the said Fausser and my daughter Anne Fausser
and I do confirm to my wife Alice Fausser and to my daughter Anne Fausser
and to their heirs and assigns by me given for ever and ever to be paid to them and their heirs
and assigns the sum of five hundred pounds per annum for ever and ever to be paid to them and their heirs
and assigns
