John Verdon it being the Plantation I now live upon to him &
his heirs lawfully begot of his body and for the want of such
heirs to my Son William Shaw and to his heirs lawfully begotten

Child I am all the rest of my Estate I give to, Equally Divided,
between my two loving daughters Ann and Mary Shaw I am I lend
to my loving wife all my whole Estate during her Widowhood and
afterward her Natural Life if she can give security that she shall not
cut down any of the trees of the Land unless it be for Rails or fire
Wood and for my two Daughters Estate. I am I make and Authorise
my dear Wife Mary Shaw executrix and my Brother Samuel Shaw
Executor of this my last Will and Testament Witness my hand and
Seal this 10th day of November 1741.
