Testament as followeth first I bequeath my soul into the hands

Saviour to Receive pardon for all my sins Secondly I bequeath
my body to the Earth for buriall as it was taken to be buried
in such decent manner as my Executors hereafter mentioned
shall thinke fitt. I humbly send all my whole Estate to my
 Loving wife Margreat Bristow during her Natural life
and after her decease to be divided as followeth I humbly Give
to my son Charles Bristow my negron boy called Bonon to him
and his heirs forever I humbly Give to my daughter Mical Bristow
my negron Gyle called Wannah to her and her heirs forever
I humbly Give to my daughter Ann Bristow my negron boy called
Wahwah to her and her heirs forever

in such decent manner as my Executors hereafter mentioned
shall thinke fitt. I humbly Send all my whole Estate to my
Loving wife Margreat Briston during her Natural life
and after her decease to be divided as followeth I humbly Give
to my son Charles Briston my negron boy called Benn to him
and his heirs forever I humbly Give to my daughter Mical Briston
my negron Yoile called Hannah to her & her heirs forever
I humbly Give to my daughter Ann Briston my neg boy called
Will to her & her heirs forever. All the rest of my Estate to be
Equally divided among all my Children Edward William
Charles Mical & Ann and I doe Appoint my Loving Wife
Margreat Briston my whole and sole Executrix of this my
Last Will and Testament she either to Give security for the
same or bring my hand and seal this 20th day of March 1740.
