they are of age and she is bound to live with my son as long as she pleases so
that she has my living & personal money & equally shared between her & also give
her a certain amount of money and that they have her full wages

I give to Gilbert Brown all my left wearing apparel and furniture and the
rest of my apparel to my white servants

I give ~~to~~ to Mr. George Clarke of St. Marys County in Maryland
the sum of

£1000 and Mr. Christopher Robinson Mr. Edm. Tucker and Mr.
Hart. Barclay and Gilbert Brown and Mr. Alexander Fraser
and Mr. John Leatherbury Executors of the my last will and Test.
And I do give to each of my Exrs. five pounds apiece to buy them out
of their duty in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal

William Steward Esq. being thirty five years or thereabouts do declare that the 14 Day of November 1720 William Gordon of Urbana desired Mr Harry Overloy to write down the first head of his will which Mr Harry Overloy did with a design to write the same will at large for the said William Gordon to sign but before that could be done the said Gordon dyed and that the said Gordon declared it to be his will at the same time that the several bequests to his four were made to him when they should come of Age of One and Twenty years which was to have been fulfilled if the will had been writ Over at large and further saith not
