what kind I ever heretofore first I bequeath my soul

merits of Jesus Christ my Redeemer and my body to be
buried by my Executors hereafter named

I do give and bequeath all my land that I am now in
with to my loving son Thomas Mountague to him and
his heirs forever

Tobacco and Corn now growing and five years of growing
and tinning and one piece of shooting tinning and
of mens shoes and stockings
