 her increase for ever and my Middle girl Phillis and one feather
 bed and furniture
 I give to my son Francis my Negro girl Frank and one Negro man
 named Tom and feather bed and furniture
 I give to my dear wife and Negro Woman named Bess and one Negro
 man named Dick and one Irish boy named Edward Jones and two feather
 beds and furniture
 I give to my Son William Porter my Long gun
 And to my son Francis my great long gun I give to John Morgan one of my
 other guns and my pocket to be equally divided between my ^{wife and} two sons and
 I give my horse and mare to my wife and the Rest of my estate to be
 equally divided between my wife and my two sons and if either of my

man house Dick and one Irish boy named Edward Bonds and tubs feather
Dress and Furniture

I give to my Son William Lorter my Long gun
and to my Son Francis my best Long gun I give to John Morgan one of my
other guns and my pocket to be equally divided between my ^{two} Sons and
I give any horse and more to my wife and the Rest of my estate to be
equally divided between my wife and my two Sons and if either of my
Sons dye before they come to Age their parts to fall to the other
and I do appoint my dear wife and my good friend Wm Barbee to be my
Executors of this my last will and Testament Witness my hand and
Seal this 15th day of July 1705
