Item I give unto Elizabeth Guttery one old pair of two pair
plates, one little and one old Chest and one cow and calfe
Item I give unto my neigbor wife Honora Dury to her and her Heires forever

Item I give unto my loving wife one hundred dollars
left of my late personal estate to her own disposal
and likewise I make her my Executrix of this my last
will and Testament as witness my hand and seal the
21st day of May 1787.
