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to do as he sees proper I do hereby disannul all other
wills or wills bills of sale or any assignment whatever
and further I do make my trusty friend James Huff and
Alexander Wiley my executors to take this my last will
and Testament and have it recorded agreeable
to Law and if there should be any debts against my
estate let my two horses be sold and payment to be
made under the seal of the County of Giles and State of Va. No 1209-889-712-17

thinks proper to pay any lawful demand that should
come against me after my death and any money
that should be owing to me shall be collected and
given to my father and mother and do make them
my heirs as long as they both shall live and then
the black girl Pige shall be the property of my trusty
