the Sale of my Land is not to be made by my Executors until
the youngest of the said four Children who shall then be living
shall have arrived at the age of nineteen years. I direct
and desire that a piece of ground on the plantation
on which I now live shall be laid off in one or more

to the said John Wells & thence along the fence next below
the barn to a place opposite to an object in the meadow
thence with that object to the north end of the same
thence to a large Sugar tree on the river bank
thence at the river to the mouth of Stroubles Creek thence
up the Creek to the Waggon Road & thence to the top of the
hill to include the dwelling house & barn & other appur-
tenances within the said boundary in Henry Hollingsworth
his said four Children Adam, James, Pegg & William
to reside on and make use of until the said Lands
are sold as above directed and until they be permitted
to cut and take fire wood from any part of the said tract or
timbers to fence or enclose the same as directed & reserved
and further to use all the Sugar trees in the said tract of
Land until the same are cleared off or enclosed & reserved
in my Will and I desire that my Executors shall observe
the said Provisions contained in the bequest in and to

Smiths Cow, whose care the Sheep keep in East and
household furniture and some few farming Utensils, the
whole of which are to be put into the possession of Mary
Trullinger and kept in the premises as above collected to
her and her four children for the use of her and her
four children ~~at her house, Oreg.~~ ~~at her house~~ or their
service as ~~servants~~ with this understanding and intention
that if she does not manage the same with economy
and propriety ~~according to the judgment of my executor~~
a majority of them, the said property shall be taken
out of her possession and also the part of the said house
and ~~upholstering~~ ~~which was~~ ~~assigned to her and her~~
children as above and shall be disposed of, rented or
as my Executor shall think fit. Item it is my will that
all my stock of horses and cattle farming Utensils and
other personal property not herein particularly mentioned
and disposed, be sold and the money arising

therefrom be equally divided by my Executors among the
said John the children of Mary Hollinger, viz. John, William,
Peggy & William & the survivors or survivors of them, and
they shall respectively attain the age of 21 years
or are married. It is my Will that all the real Estate
Liquor, Corn in the Bush, grain in the stacks & in the

for the present year, I do hereby empower my Executors to
recollect and make proper conveyances of Lands to be
