1799 I Elizabeth wife of the late John Stoughton
of Virginia do hereby make and publish my last will and testament
to be in force into law Therefore calling to mind the
frailty of our bodies and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make and Ordain that my last will and
testament be in force into my beloved Wife Sarah
Stoughton the wife of my (deceased) son John Stoughton with
all the appurtenances during her Natural life and after her
decease to George Stoughton during his Natural life and after
his decease to go to David Miller to him his heirs and assigns
and I do hereby bequeath to my Wife Sarah Stoughton all my
five share (or parts) or parts of the house to George Stoughton
together with all the household furniture the Wagon (farm
-ing) Wagon also my rat standing table to be collected by my
Executors hereafter named together with what money I have
after my death to her which I desire I should I will
that she should live to make a good use of it

Said to me by my brother William Stephen in the
State of Virginia that as to order or return of the same
make take or said & such other as I think fit to make
as they think proper and to make good & sufficient letters
therein and the money arising therefrom to be received in
Manner following I have first to my wife Sarah I have one
hundred and fifty pounds the balance to be divided
equally between all the children of the said William Stephen
I have my beloved wife Sarah Stephen & David Stephen
my whole sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament
do hereby certify that the true and
above mentioned
