

In the name of God amen I Daniel Bonner of this County of Montgomery
being of sound mind, memory and understanding call my mind
the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed unto
all men once to die, do therefore make and give this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following (to wit)

Item 1. I recommend my soul to God in hope of a joyful Resur-
rection at the last day, and my body to be buried in a decent man-
ner at the discretion of my Executors herein after named.

Item 2. I will and desire that all my just debts be paid and
my funeral charges defrayed.

Item 3. I bequeath unto my dear and loving wife Mary Bonner,
one horse suitable for her to ride, two cows & calves and the stone
leng house where we now live, during her life for her own proper
use and benefit and to receive from my four sons herein after
named, twenty Dollars from each of them annually during
her life.

Item 4. I give and bequeath unto the Baptist Society the land enclosed within the fence round the meeting house, extending the front square of the fence down to where the Best mountain road crosses the branch, to them and their Successors forever.

Item 5. I bequeath to my son Andrew Connor one hundred and fifty acres of land, part of the home place including the improvements in his number of acres, beginning at a corner white oak at the mouth of meadow

Item 6. I bequeath to my son Jonathan Connor, the balance of that tract of land whereon www.virginiapioneers.net and as much of the tract he now lives on as will make in the whole one hundred and fifty acres.

Item 7. I will and bequeath unto my son William Connor my tract of land known by the name of the Elary's containing one hundred and fifty acres.

Item 8. My will and desire is that the remainder of that tract of land whereon my son Jonathan now lives, should be equally divided between my two sons Daniel & David Connor.

Item 9. I give and bequeath the whole of the residue of the tract of land part whereon I now live to my son Andrew Connor my son David

Item 11. I give and bequeath to my daughter Barbara Smith one bar
Item 11. I give and bequeath unto my other four daughters, Mary
Hill, Rebecca Read, and Sarah Connor, and Christiana Connor
and their heirs, four hundred acres being the survey lying
down meadow run, to be equally divided among them

Item 12. I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary Connor all and
singular my household furniture during her life.

Item 13. ~~I desire and my will is that all my stock except what is~~
~~heretofore named and bequeathed to be by my executors, and~~
~~the amount thereof to be paid to my youngest daughter Christiana Connor~~

Item 14. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Connor a bay
horse which is not intended to be included with all my stock and
have before mentioned to be sold.

Item 15. I desire and my will is, that my four sons Jonathan,
William, Andrew, and Jacob Connor, to pay to their mother twenty
dollars each, to be paid annually, to her during her life according

to Thomas Stern in this my last will and testament.

Item 16 I nominate, appoint and make, my two sons Jonathan and
Andrew Conner, my true and legal executors of this my last will
and testament. March 13th 1870

At Montgomery January 1st 1875 This last will &
and testament of Daniel Conner dec'd was presented
in Court and together with the original thereof

of January (year 1870) His last Will
and Testament of Daniel Conner dec'd, was proved
in Court, and together with the Codicil thereto
were proven by the oaths of Humphrey Smith
and Henry Juddys and ordered to be Recorded.
And on the motion of Jonathan Conner one of
the Executors therein named (the other Executor
Andrew Conner refusing to Act) who made oath
themselves as the Law directs and with Security
into and Acknowledged Bonds in the penalty
of four hundred Dollars conditioned
as the Law directs. Certificate is granted
him for obtaining a probat thereof in due
form
