with all the appurtenances thereto adjoining. To have and
to hold to my said son John Price and his heirs forever his

a follower - To my Daughter Mary Ten pounds to be paid
five pounds in the said year he be ten to age and to my
Daughter Mary Ten pounds within one after her age
and to my Daughter Elizabeth Ten pounds within two years
after her age and to my Daughter Hannah Ten pounds within
one year after her age and to my five younger sons
within one year after and what shall remain after
my Wife's third part is taken out and my other movable
and immovable are sold I have at my death I desire
to be equally divided among my five children that is
