make and declare this my last Will and Testament
in manner following. I recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God that gave it and as my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at
the discretion of my Executors, And as touching such worldly
estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this
life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the follow-
ing manner to wit. First I give and bequeath unto
Mary my dearly beloved wife, one Acre, one Mutch Horse
and one Spinning wheel. I also enjoin her that she continue
to live single and does not marry after my decease, I

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my house in Montgomery County which ever she shall
choose during her life or whilst she may live single or an

widow but on the proviso that she marries I give her
nothing but the best of what above is intended.

I also will that whosoever of my sons my wife shall choose
to live with her during her life shall take his share

that she shall choose I will that he shall provide for her
as well as all the other children of life that

shall stand in need of during her life or otherwise
whilst she shall live single but if she marries she is
to have no claim. I give and bequeath unto my wife

belonging first born son Henry Davis Davis the sum of
ten thousand dollars to be received of the plantation

located in the County of the same name
of which I am the owner to which wife of

to my beloved daughter William Price all the land and
tenement that I have in the County of Rockingham and I
also constitute her my sole and true and lawful
executors of this my last will. Testam. at end of
her by attornys disabill and revoke all former Testaments
with her assent the curles Relying and conforming to
and no other to be my last will & Testam. in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this second
day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred & eighty five

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Witnesseth that all my aforesaid
Estate be equally divided between my daughter
signed, sealed, published, pronounced
and declared by the said Henry Price
in presence of us as his last will & Testament
