to Decency and Kindness as they can agree or after
disinterested persons to settle but it is to be observed that
my son is to pay his Brother Joseph Taylor the
sum of fifty pounds my son William Taylor

the sum of fifty pounds in the
money of Virginia due the Estate of two years after my
decease, let it be returned my Cousin Isaac Taylor and
thereat his Will is to have the same in full satisfaction
of the land below my house on Non oak bearing information
that the money that it is in Mr David Woods hands who
is the sum of eight pounds current money of Virginia I leave
to my daughter Maria Briggs, fifty pounds in cash
I leave to my daughter Mary Taylor as soon as it can be
collected by my Executors my stock of every kind and move-
able property except my husband's I leave to my son Joseph
Taylor and all out standing debts I wish below money
I leave included my large Bible I leave to my son
William Taylor This instrument of writing I testify to

Montgomery April Court 1804

This Last Will and Testament of Isaac Taylor deceased was presented in Court and proved by the Oath of James Robertson James Robertson and James Anderson the witnesses thereto And the legacies to be received

And in the Motion of Senae Taylor, and among the
Persons there named, who made Oath, entered into
and acknowledged bonds as the Law directs. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of
February 1796.

In the Name of God: I, John Robinson, of Mont-
gomery County being of sound mind and memory do make
this my last Will and Testament. First and principally I re-
commend my soul to God who gave it, and my body I resign
to the earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Execu-
tors. As touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God
to bestow on me I will devise and dispose of in the manner
following. Viz. I will and direct that all my Just
debts be paid by my Executors out of my Personal Estate by
