I Edw. Graham of the County of Montgomery in the Commonwealth of Virginia, being of a sound mind, understanding the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time it may happen, have determined to make this my last Will and Testament in manner following, that is to say

I give and bequeath to my son James Graham Twenty shillings, I give and bequeath to Enoch Graham, seven shillings, I give and bequeath to John Graham, one dollar, I give and bequeath to Oliver Johnson, one dollar, I give and bequeath to Matthew Hancock, one dollar, I give and bequeath to Matthew Graham, one dollar, I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Graham all my horses called and stock of every kind, all farming utensils, house hold furniture and two hundred acres of land to include the farms, I now live on, I give and bequeath

Jonathan Graham, one hundred acres land adjoining, ~~was~~ he now lives. I give and bequeath to my son Elias Graham, one hundred acres of land ~~was~~ he lives. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Jonathan Graham and Jacob Graham, Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others and former wills and Testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and appointed my seal this 10th day of June in the year 1812.
