Established to be sold. But then my command shall make good
such a will. It is my will that my son Robert French
shall have his share likewise going to William French
to have two shares & the remaining shares to be divided
equally among my three daughters Mary, Betty, &
Elizabeth. I say also that these my
legacies pay unto my son French ~~one~~ ^{two} dollars. One to
Elizabeth to my son John ~~French~~ ^{French}. One to Mary also
my daughter ~~one~~ ^{two} dollars by one dollar if I do constitute
and appoint my friends Nathan Gibson & John French
as my lawful executors of this my last will of testa-
ment between my friend John Davidson Guardian
for my beloved wife to see her justice done & do a
Constitution then to be my last will and Testament
disavowing all others, by me made heretofore
I found under my hand shall this twenty Eighth day of
February in year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & fourty

Reynolds Surveyor of the Middle Marks and ordered to be
Recorded - and at Nottingham following. On the part of John
Bird and William Towsley who made with him according to law
and with full Bird and William Reynolds their signatures
entered into and acknowledged them Birds on the penalty
of five hundred dollars conditions as the law doth
allow for granting him for obtaining letters of administration
on the estate of James Towsley and with his wife among
others of the worth the sum to be paid him
