In the name of God. I, Mary Carlton of
the Town of Blackburg, Montgomery County,
Virginia, being a sound body, but of sound

disposing mind and memory do hereby make

and publish this following to be my last Will

and testament in manner and form following

(viz):

Item I desire my body to be decently buried

and the execution of my executors herein after

named and after my funeral charges and last

debts are paid I leave and bequeath my worldly

estate as follows

Item I, having purchased the house and lot on

which I now live in Blackburg in partnership

with my beloved sister Susanna Carlton, I hereby

relinquish all my right title and interest in

and to the said house and lot to her desiring that

it may be disposed of to raise certain legacies

Item 2^d Having purchased the house and lot on
which I & a brother in partnership
with my beloved Sister Susanna Carlton, I hereby
testify with all my right title and interest in
and to the said house and lot to, her desiring that
it may be disposed of to raise certain legacies
herein after mentioned.

Item 3^d And I hold jointly with my said Sister,
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the sum of one hundred and eighty eight dollars,
to be paid my money to her (Susanna)
Item 4th I also give and bequeath unto my said
Sister Susanna Carlton all and every of the estate
which I have left to me by the last will of my deceased
father, whether the same be real or personal estate
Item 5th And I do, the following legacies to be raised
from or sold, the house and lot above mentioned I now give
and bequeath to her and her heirs.

I Bequeath to my Brother Joseph Barton one hundred
in my Brother in Law Samuel Edwards I give one
hundred Dollars to my Brother William Barton
I give one hundred dollars to the children here
of my Brother Henry Barton deceased I give four
hundred Dollars to ^{be} equally divided amongst them
to be more explicit my Executors herein after
named is to sell the said house and for the
purpose of Raising and paying the above named
legacies Should the sale of the property be insuff-
cient my said Sister is to make up the
said legacies
Item 6th The negro woman named Melly
which was purchased jointly by my Sister
Susanna and myself I devise my Interest
to my Sister ~~Susanna~~ after the death of her
that she shall emancipate her imme-
diately after my decease, and that my said
Sister Susanna shall also give the said Negro

Sister Susanna shall also give the said Negro
woman fully one feather Bed and fifty dollars
in money to be paid as soon as convenient
after my decease.

Now if any and all estate of which I may
die possessed of not hereto before named I give
and bequeath unto my said Sister Susanna
Cartton, and fully I appoint my beloved

Sister Susanna Cartton my sole Executrix
to see my last will and Testament Revolving

all other and ratifying and confirming this
and this only to be my last will and Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 3rd day of August in the
year of Christ 1819
