In the name of God amonst, I Matthew Scott of
Montgomery County, and state of Virginia being
weak in body, but of sound mind, memory and
understanding, and desirous to make my last will and
having all my worldly affairs settled,
before the terrors of death approach, do make
and publish this my last will and testament,
that is to say, my will written to the hand,

of God who gave it, and my body to the Earth
to be decently buried at the decease of my
body according to custom after named, and
my estate both real and personal, I give
and bequeath as follows to wit:

Item 1. I give and bequeath unto my dear
and beloved wife forty acres, part of my land

of having all my worldly affairs settled,
before the turnings of death's alarum, to make
and bequeath this my last will and testament,
that is to say, commanding my soul unto the hands
of God who gave it, and my body to the Earth
to be decently buried at the intercession of my
~~wife~~ executors hereafter named, and

my estate both real and personal, give
and bequeath as follows to wit —
Now I give and bequeath unto my dear
and beloved wife, forty acres, part of my land
located including the timber house and
two negroes, Sam and Ned, also two mds
horses, one team of sheep and six hds.

of horses, one bed and furniture, also all my table furniture and one of
my best chairs, all which she is to have and enjoy during her life.
Item 2. My will and desire is that my plantation
or original tract of land be divided between my two sons John P. Johnson
and Charles Brock like the time of division and that John have
his part on the west side. - Item 3. I give unto my son John one tract of
land of one hundred and eighty five acres lying on the north side
of the old survey on Bons brook. - Item 4. I give and bequeath to my

daughter Elizabeth one tract of land of seventy eight acres lying south of the
old survey, one one horse colt. Item 5. I give to my daughter Mary one
tract of land of one hundred and sixty three acres lying on Beaver
dam. Item 6. I give unto my two daughters (a negro girl named Sally,
Mary and Elizabeth) Item 7. I give all my household furniture excepting
my wifes part already mentioned, to my three daughters Delilah, Mary
and Elizabeth, to be equally divided between them. Item 8. I give unto
my daughter Anna fifty dollars to be paid by my executors.

Item 9. I will and desire that the two negroes named above
be the property of my son John at my wife's decease in condition
that she leave the rest of the children an equal part of the value of the
house and land.

Item 10. My will is that all my personal property that has not been before
distributed, to any one, be sold by my executors on a reasonable credit and the
proceeds thereof to be equally divided among all my children
Thomas, Hercules, John and John, also Deleah, Diana, Henry,
Prudence, Elizabeth and that be given her to my surviving son by
or undivided interest in the same after her death and the money arising
from the sale of the personal property to be equally among all

my children Item 11. I nominate appoint and make my two sons
John and John executors of this my last will and testament
