last will and perfect mind and memory do make and declare this my last
will and Testament, in form following, I will and bequeath my soul to
god, and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian
like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named, and
as to such worldly estate wherewith I have been blessed in this life, I
will and dispose of the same as follows. It is my will and desire that
all my just debts and funeral expences be first paid out of my personal
estate or so much thereof as may be necessary for that purpose and I
Order the same accordingly. I give to my son David one Negro Woman
Slave with, he paying therefore to my Executors the sum of Two hundred
dollars, I give to my son Michael a small Negro boy slave he paying
therefor to my Executors the sum of fifty dollars and to his son Lewis
and to my big bible. I give to my son David a Negro boy slave with, he
paying therefore to my Executors the sum of one hundred and thirty three
dollars therefor three cents of

god, and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian
like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereon after named, and
is to such worldly estate wherewith I have been blessed in this life, I
will and dispose of the same as follows Viz. It is my will and desire that
all my just debts and funeral expences be first paid out of my personal
estate or so much thereof as may be necessary for that purpose and I
order the same accordingly. I give to my son David one Negro Woman
Slave Will, he paying therefor to my Executors the sum of Two hundred
dollars, I give to my son Michael a small Negro boy Leger he paying
therefor to my Executors the sum of fifty dollars and to his son Lewis a
sentimental bay big bible. I give to my son Jacob a Negro boy slave Will, he
paying therefor to my Executors the sum of one hundred and thirty three
dollars thirty three cents. Also my house clock, still and stilling wench
including a large copper kettle, he paying therefor to my Executors the sum
of one hundred dollars. I leave my black Smith's tools he paying to my
son Christian in full the sum of fifteen pounds. I give to my son
James a Negro Woman Slave living and her marriage debt in his possession

also my son John and appointed myself the paying thereof to my son George the sum of Two hundred and Twenty dollars I gave to my son George the Waggon and Saddle &c. without the harness or gear, he paying therefor ~~the sum of twenty pounds to them generally and their heirs~~ forever and should it so happen that any of the negroes aforesaid should be emancipated or kept out of the estate, then and in that case I will and Order that the price of such slave or slaves be remitted to such of my said son or sons as may chance to lose the same. It is my Will and desire that in case my Wife Margaret should survive me that she have and enjoy her Bed & bedding, wearing whet and other household furniture during her natural life also one full & equal third part in addition to the aforesaid bequest of all my estate that I may die possessed of for her comfort and support but should she marry after my decease, she is to have & receive of my estate no more than a child's part, and I will & devise the same accordingly, and wheresoever there may be some of my real estate not disposed of and personal estate not herein before devised, I Order that such part or parcel of any such remains, and the money in the hands of my Executors, and all moneys which may come into their hands by virtue of

such part or parcel of any such revenues, and the money in the hands of
my executor, and all moneys which may come into their hands by virtue of
this my Will, be equally divided among all my Children and their legal
representatives alone (my son Alexander excepted) and I devise the same
Accordingly. And for the due execution of this my Will I do appoint my
Widder Friend & Neighbour James Patton Preston and my going David & Henry
my whole & sole Executors, hereby revoking and making void all former
Wills by me made, declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament.

proof. And at November Court 1802, the said Will was further sworn
by the oath of James P. Preston gentleman a second Will thereto which is
ordered to be recorded. And at April Court 1803 the
