his Montgomery being in a low state of health but of sound memory and being near
last Will think to testify God for the same do make and give constitute and appoint
this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as follows to wit
I give and bequeath unto my last beloved wife Sarah Beckell the

plantation that on and the riding more in particular and all the acci-
 tals of said plantation and all the house furniture and all the house
 cattle hogs and sheep during her lifetime and after her death the
 house plantation to fall to my son William Beckell to him and his
 heirs forever and a piece of land as I have had of adjoining land Ep-
 party to my son Thomas Beckell to him and his heirs forever also a
 piece of land adjoining Felix Terry I give to my son Jacob Beckell to him
 and his heirs forever also a piece of land adjoining Hall and Scotts I give
 to my son John Beckell to him and his heirs forever also a piece of land
 adjoining the lands of Thomas Harrison I leave to my son James Beckell. I
 desire my son Thomas Beckell to pay my son Richard Beckell ten pounds in
 property also my son William Beckell to pay my son Richard Beckell ten
 pounds in property when he comes to age also that my wife shall pay my
 son Richard Beckell ten pounds in property and after my wife's decease

all my moveable Estate to be Equally divided between my six daughters that
is to say Ann, Rebekah, Mary, Ruth, Susannah, Martha Bickett
I do hereby Nominate and appoint Susannah Bickett my wife and
John Bickett my son whole and sole executors of this my last Will and
Testament as Witness my hand and seal this 26th day of November 1803
