shillings Likewise to my daughter Sarah Rice the sum
of five shillings to my daughter Rachel Guiness the
sum of five shillings each like money and I gave to
my daughter Mary Davis five shillings the rest &
residue of my goods and Chattels and personal
Estate, after payment of my Debts Legacies and personal
Expenses I give unto my Son Elijah Bulancy whom I
make my sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament I give devise and bequeath to him and
his heirs all and every my Messuages Lands
Tenements whatsoever I do possess or shall possess

Richards and William Prosser, the Witnesses
(Shrubs and oaths to be Recorded) And at August
following, on the motion of Elijah Calaney the

executed, named in the Will of Samuel Watkins, per
Admitted to Record at last Court, who made oath
thereof according to Law, and with George Burkitt
his security entered into and acknowledged their
Bond in the penalty of Three hundred Dollars
conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is
granted him for obtaining a precat thereof.

Montgomery County Wills, Deeds, Estates, No 2, 1809-1817

The Commonwealth of Virginia to the Sheriff of
Montgomery County Greeting, whereas Abijah Booth
who owns the Land on both sides of Beaver creek in this
County desiring to build a Water Grist Mill on the said Land
and to erect a Dam across the said creek for working the
said Mill, have made application to our County Court
of a Montgomery for a writ of est quoddamnam which hath
been awarded him according to Law. Therefore we command
you that you summon and compel all persons
to meet on the 25th day of this month upon the Lands proposed
for the abutment which are to be built.
