my daughter Mary Davis five shillings the rest &  
residue of my goods and Chattels and personal  
Estate, after payment of my Debts Legacies and personal  
Expenses and unto my son Elijah Dalany whom I  
make my sole Executor of this my last Will and  
Testament I give devise and bequest to him and  
his heirs all and every my Messuages Land

Richards and William Proise of the Witnesses  
(Shrubs and oaths to be Recorded) And at August  
following on the motion of Elijah Calaney the

executed pursuant to the Will of Samuel Watkins proved &  
Admitted to Record at last Court, who made such  
Writs according to Law, and with George Burkitt  
his Security entered into and acknowledged their  
Bond in the penalty of Three hundred Dollars  
Conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is  
granted him for obtaining a probat thereof.

The Court of Chancery of Virginia to the Sheriff of  
Montgomery County Greeting whereas Abijah Booth  
who owns the Land on both sides of Beaver creek in the  
County desiring to build a Water Great Mill on the said Land  
and to erect a Dam across the said creek for working the  
said Mill, have made application to our County Court  
of a Montgomery for a writ of *quoddamnam* which hath  
been awarded him according to Law. Therefore we command  
you that you summon and compel all persons  
to meet on the 25th day of this month upon the Lands proposed  
for the abatement which are to be
