sion is made, they shall have equally alike and the
balance to be divided equally between them after
my heirs (except my wife's part) I will also my
two sons to be divided as follows, beginning at Sodden
house at the head of the Spring at the cross place

line, at the head of the Spring at the surface
and with that force as it runs to the head down
and to continue the same course in a direct
line to the opposite side that is to be true betw
new bridge back to that part he now lives. on
Ano if my wife Should Marry she shall re
turn her part of the marriage in a Stock, and
I do hereby make my wife and my son

this my last will and testament for witness
