Montgomery County and State of Virginia being a sober
body of sound mind thank God to this 16 day of
September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and ten make and give this my last will
and testament in manner and form following, to wit
first my Will and desire is that my debts and general
charges be paid. And I desire the Tract of Land
lately purchased from William Woolwine containing
119 Acres be sold and a legal bill made by my
Executors for the same and the money arising
therefrom to be divided in three equal parts giving
one third to my daughter Mary Duncan one third
to my daughter Martha Morgan and one third
to my daughter Ann Casada. I further desire
that all my other lands be divided between my
three daughters above named in the following man-
ner the lower end of the tract from the Cedar Spring
up to a hollow running through the up land field
commonly called the Model field I give to
my daughter Mary.

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to a shallow Runway through the up land field
commonly called the Middle field. I give to
my daughter Mary Duncan during her natural
life and the life of her husband Seth Duncan
and after their decease to go to my grand son
Joseph Morgan and in case he should die before
said Seth or Mary Duncan and without benefit
of my Will in that then the Land shall be
vested in said Duncan and wife and be all then
disposed of by Will further that the Land up grain
the first time to a line running from a
place on the south hill side marked by an
old white oak in near a south direction at the
foot of the North hill side and in that direction
till it intersects the old fallow line and then
running so as to include the outlay on the south
side of said land to my daughter Mary the
Morgan in her husband John Morgan during
their natural life and after their decease to go

my grand son Harry Morgan in case he should out-
live them My Will further is that all my land
lying about the before mentioned line I leave to my
daughters Ann Capshaw her being the 10th part
is that my daughter Mary Duncan have my old
bay mare and that my daughter Sarah Wilson have
12 dollars paid her in a cow upon my Will so
that amount of further Will that my outstanding debts
be collected by my Executors and any balance of property
which I may be possessed of be applied to the
discharge of my debts and any balance that may
be left I leave in the hands of Seth Duncan to be
applied to schooling of my grand son Joseph
Morgan I therefore leave my trusty friends Seth
Duncan and David Miller Executors of this my
last Will and Testament sign'd with my hand
the day and year first above written.
