Will of abram Homas Harrell

In the name of God, Amen.

I, Abram Thomas Harrell of Nansemend County, Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare my last will and testament in manner and form fellowing, hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made.

Fourth: I give, devise and bequeath to my son Percy Samuel Harrell, my name farm, in fee simple forever, and my cattle, with his choice of the team belonging to me, the other team to be appraised and Percy to have any or all of them at the appraisement if he decires if not, they are to be sold. I also devise that he (Percy) shall have his choice of sow or sow and pigs. The memainder of hogs to be appraised and (Percy) to have them or part of them at the appraisement if he desires, if not, they are to be sold. Also I desire him to have all my farm tools.

Fifth: I give, de vise and bequeath to my son Stanley Claudius Harrell (\$500.000 Five Hundred dellars from my estate, and also a good bed and plenty of cover to go with it.

Sixth: I give, devise and bequeath to my grand-daughter, MaryEmma Harrell, all my Bank stock in the American Bank of Suffolk and enough from my estate to total (\$500.00) Five Hundred dollars, and my share in the Piano.

Seventh: I give, devise and bequeath to my grand-daughter, Mildred Louise Harrell (\$500.00) Five Hundred dellars from my estate.

Eighth: I will that after the above division is made should there be a surplus that it be qually divided between my sons, Jasper T. Harrekl, Percy S. Harrell and Stanley C. Harrell.

Ninth: I hereby nominate and appoint my sons, Jasper T. Harrell, Percy S. Harrell and Stankey C. Harrell to be the Executors of this my last will and testatment and hereby request that they be allowed to serve without security.

Ninth: I hereby nominate and appoint my sons, Jasper T. Harrell, Percy S. Harrell and Stankey C. Harrell to be the Executors of this my last will and testatment and hereby request that they be allowed to serve without security.
